Assessment methods: <i>During the semester, students will prepare a term project on a given topic, which will be assessed by max. 60 points. Credits will not be awarded to students who do not hand in the projects assigned. Final evaluation: oral examination, term project. Assessment A - 94-100 points, Assessment B – 86 - 93 points, Assessment C – 76-85 points, Assessment D – 66-75 points, Assessment E – 56-65 points.</i>	
Learning outcomes of the course unit: <i>Students will become aware of philosophical thinking as the solution to philosophical problems. In examples chosen (ontological, epistemological, axiological, methodological, etc.) related to problems of philosophy, students will learn about solving philosophical problems in different historical stages and from different philosophical points of view. In addition, students will master elementary philosophical terminology and become familiar with the most important historical events and personalities of philosophical thought.</i>
