Assessment methods: <i>Continuous assessment: at least 50% attendance at lectures, active and creative teamwork in making and giving a presentation of the term project on the quality of life in Slovakia in accordance with the course content. A grade - 10 points, B grade - 9 points, C grade - 8 points, D grade - 7 points, E grade - 6 points. Credits will not be awarded to students whose term project was assessed with less than 6 points. Final assessment: end of semester during the examination period: written examination.</i>	
Learning outcomes of the course unit: <i>Students completing the course will be equipped with the theoretical background of quality of life. Students will be aware of socio-economic and psychological aspects of quality of life. Students will understand how quality of life is measured and will be able to distinguish many related concepts (life, lifestyle, living, social quality, well-being, life satisfaction, happiness). After successful completion, students will be ready to continue in their university studies.</i>

Sphere of quality of life.</i> <i>8. Value system of the population.</i> <i>9. Social inequalities and differentiation of population.</i> <i>10. Spatial aspects of quality of life.</i> <i>11. The European dimensions of quality of life.</i> <i>12. Global lifestyle.</i> <i>13. Free theme chosen by students. Consultation.</i>
