Credit will not be granted to a student who obtains in seminar for less than 17 points. Final assessment: at the end of the semester exam period: Oral examination. Final evaluation: average.</i>	
Learning outcomes of the course unit: <i>A student completing the course obtains an overview of the theoretical basis of social policy as a discipline in pursuit of improving living conditions and quality of life of inhabitants. The student will be able to comprehend the problem issue under the Ministry of Labour, Social Affairs and Family, with emphasis on the labour market, employment policy and social security in the Slovak Republic. The student will understand problem areas and current issues of social policy in the European context and also analyzes of socially and economically suitable solutions. After successful completion of a learning process the student will be ready to continue the follow-up university studies.</i>

Social policy – definition, outline of development, object, subject, principles, functions, tools, models and objectives.</i> <i>3. Relations of labour law and labour income</i> <i>4. Labour market, labour market policy, employment policy. The European Social Fund.</i> <i>5. Poverty and social exclusion. Material deprivation and a living wage</i> <i>6. Welfare.</i> <i>7. Corporate social policy.</i> <i>8. Policy of education.</i> <i>9. Social aspects of housing.</i> <i>10. Health and health insurance.</i> <i>11. The third sector and volunteering in social policy.</i> <i>12. Quality of life and its measurement.</i> <i>13. Free theme chosen by the students. Consultation.</i>
