Learning outcomes of the course unit: <i>Students by completing the course will gain knowledge of basic concepts relating to civil law as a separate legal sector and its sources, scope, and characteristics of civil relations system. The student should be able to define the concept of legal personality, physical or legal entity and its types, legal action and its breakdown. The student should understand the basic principles of civil law, legitimate and testamentary succession process of concluding civil actions. After completion of the study process within the course student should be able to do an analysis of objective law, especially property rights, mutual and undivided ownership. Student should know the basic content elements of selected legal acts within the law of obligations, such as purchase contract, donation contract, contract for work, loan, contract for borrowing, lease contract and others.</i>

Consumer contracts.</i> <i>5. The right of ownership, possession and legal protection.</i> <i>6. Liability for damages in civil law.</i> <i>7. Inheritance law - general characteristics. Testamentary succession. Succession by law.</i> <i>8. The general part of the law of obligations.</i> <i>9. Purchase contract, interchangeable contract, consumer sales contracts, donation contract.</i> <i>10. Contract for work, insurance contracts.</i> <i>11. Lease contract. Legal regime for apartments and office space.</i> <i>12. Selected types of contractual civil law - loan agreement, the lending, contract of custody, contract of carriage, agreement to sell.</i> <i>13. The topic chosen by students. Consultations.</i>
