Assesment methods: <i>Evaluation during the course is based on the preparation of papers, practical exercises and presentation of the overall assessment max. 30 points. On completion of a course the student must pass an oral examination with assessment max. 70 points.</i> <i>To pass the course the student must obtain at least 60 points of a possible 100 points. Overall evaluation will be awarded on the basis of test results, ongoing activities and results of the work during the semester.</i>	
Learning outcomes of the course unit: <i>A student passing the subject obtains an overview of instruments and the regulation of economic processes. The student will be able to characterize the instruments of economic policy in the conditions of Slovak economy. The student will understand economic processes and their relationship, as a complex whole, its coordination using mainly specialized economic tools. After the successful completion of a learning process student will be able to do analysis of state intervention and describe different instruments of state policy.</i>
