#### Assesment methods:

Conditions for passing the subject are met in two phases: during the semester from seminars students can get 50 points and for a successful execution of the test they can also get 50 points. The final grade will come from the sum of the two ratings. During the semester, the student has the option of obtaining the following points: participation in seminars - 1 p, a total of 11 p; activity in discussions - 2 b, total - 22 p; seminar work with presentation - 8 p; written (s) test (s) - 9 p. Credit will not be given to a student who during the assessment during the semester has obtained less than 26 points, it means they are unable to take the final exam.

### Learning outcomes of the course unit:

Student by completing the course will gain basic knowledge about politics and its place in society, the political life at home and in the world. Student will be able to handle the issue of origin and history of political thinking development, beginning with ancient Greek political thinking, through its Renaissance appearance up to the bourgeois ideology from its inception to the present. Also, the student will understand the human rights and freedoms issues, in addition to the possibility of redress when their possible violations.

After successful completion of the learning process student will be able to draw conclusions about the political life at home and in the world, on the operation of political parties and politicians for the welfare of their voters and all citizens of the country. Student will have an overview of various political parties, figuring in the political system and will be able to find the way how to give the priority in political struggle, the culmination of which are elections whether to parliament, municipal parliaments (HTU), municipal councils and presidential elections. Student will be able to assess the foreign policy of our country to the world the other way around.
