<p>Learning outcomes of the course unit: <i>Student by completing the course will obtain an overview of knowledge related to turbulent processes occurring in the system of world economics and politics. In the process of knowledge acquisition in this course, students are led to believing that globalization respectively. interdependency processes should be understood as processes of knowledge generalization and in socio-economic development tendency- in unity and interaction of internal and external social and economic conditions of world economic and political environment development in the use of the latest advances in science and technology. Particular topics deal with basic areas of global issues. The first circuit includes global challenges - intersocial, ie for example, the problem of reconstruction of international relations, the problem of the danger of war, the problem of backwardness of developing countries, poverty, the external debt of developing countries and so on. The second area is covered by natural and social issues such as demographic, the use of natural resources, ecological and food. Special attention is also paid to sustainable development. The third area is characterized by the phenomenon of globalization in the context of the global economy - the theory of economic complex, the status of major economic and political superpowers (US, EU and Japan) under the international economics triad. After successful completion of a study, student will be able not only to identify the factors of global discontinuities, but also recognize the valence and evolutionary gradation of their mutual ties, and then he/she will be able to develop presumed scenarios of the future development prediction, which would allow to work out and implement a purposeful global strategy.</i></p>
