## **Information sheet for the course History of Public Administration**

**Course prerequisites:** 

**Assessment methods:** During the semester there will be one written test per 10 points: Assessment A and - 10 points, Assessment B - 9 points, Assessment C - 8 points, Assessment D - 7 points, Assessment E - 6 points. Credits will not be added to the student who will get less than 6 points from the test. At the end of the semester during the examination period: Exam. The final score - achieved average.

Learning outcomes of the course unit: Student by completing the course gains an overview of the state administration in the territory of Slovakia since early times until today. Student will be able to interpret the history of public administration from the first state formations - the Principality of Nitra, Great Moravia, then the period of Hungarian state with emphasis on Josephine reforms as the beginning of modern public administration era. Student will get a good overview of the administrative system of the Austro-Hungarian Empire, the first Czechoslovak Republic, but also report on the territory of Slovakia in the period 1939 - 1945, as well as the period of post-war Czechoslovakia and single Slovakia, with emphasis on the ongoing reforms. Student will understand the definition by pre-state organizational forms to modern forms of human society organization. Student will be able to make analysis based on historical knowledge and links contained within the course History of public administration.

## **Course contents:**

- 1. Introduction to the lectures Course content, recommended literature, requirements for getting credit, for passing the test. Pre-state organizational forms of human society the basic concepts.
- 2. Development of administration from Samo's Empire, in the Principality of Nitra and Great Moravian Empire.
- 3. Reform of the state administration in the Hungarian state.
- 4. Maria Theresa and Josephine reforms as the beginning of modern public administration era.
- 5. A breakthrough in the public administration development in the period of 1848 1849
- 6. Development of Public Administration in 1848 1868.
- 7. Stabilization of public administration in Austria-Hungary.
- 8. Administration system of Czechoslovakia in 1918 the 1939th
- 9. Public administration in Czech Republic in the Protectorate and in Slovakian state until 1948.
- 10. Public administration in the period of 1948 1968
- 11. Public administration in the period of 1968 1990
- 12. Public administration and its reform after 1990 and after 1993.
- 13. Free topic chosen by students. Consultation.
