Assessment methods: <i>A student obtains 50 points per semester for:</i> <i>- Active participation at lectures.</i> <i>- Oral examination (50 points).</i> <i>To obtain A, a student must score at least 47 points, to obtain B, a student must score at least 43 points, to obtain C, a student must obtain at least 39 points, to obtain D, a student must obtain at least 35 points, and finally to obtain E, a students must to obtain at least 30 points.</i>	
Learning outcomes of the course unit: <i>After the completion of the course a student has knowledge of the structure and operation of central and peripheral nervous system, the general neurology and neurophysiology, from basic neurological disorders (central and peripheral paresis, Parkinson's disease, sclerosis mltiplex, hyperkinetic syndromes, cerebellar syndrome, spinal cord lesions, the central coordinating disorder). A student can define the following concepts: neuron, synapse, reflex arc, neuromuscular junction, can conduct basic eurological examination, principle of auxiliary examination methods in neurology (CT, MRI, I / T curve). A student is able to apply the obtained knowledge within the scope of physiotherapy in the patients with nervous system damage.</i>
