Learning outcomes of the course unit:	
<i>Students completing the course Nursing in Surgery acquire knowledge of nursing care for patients with surgical diseases. They can describe different parts of perioperative care in surgery branches. After completion of the course, they are able to implement the nursing process in the surgery department, to assess patients, to determine nursing diagnosis, to plan and implement troubleshooting of a surgical patient. After implementing of interventions they can evaluate the result of the application of specific interventions. The student is able to understand and apply the various activities in implementing the tasks of a nurse in the prevention and treatment of surgical diseases.</i>

Nursing care for patients with surgical disease of esophagus, stomach.	

7. *Nursing care for patients with surgical diseases of the small and large intestine. Nursing care of patients with hernia.*
8. *Nursing care for patients with surgical disease of the respiratory system.*
9. *Nursing care for patients with surgical disease of the liver, biliary tract and pancreas.*
10. *Nursing care for patients with surgical vascular disease. Nursing care for patients with breast cancer.*
11. *Nursing care for patients with surgical disease of head and neck. Nursing care for patients with surgical disease of thyroid gland.*
12. *Nursing care for patients with head injury, for patients with a fracture.*
13. *Nursing care for patients with acute abdominal pain.*
