- 9. J. M. Keynes and his contribution to the development of economic science, further development of Keynesian economics.
- 10. Neoliberalism and model of social market economy.
- 11. Economic theory of monetarism.
- 12. Chicago School, theory of rational expectation, new classic macroeconomics.
- 13. Theory of economic offer, institutional economic theories institutional and neo-institutional economy, new institutional economy.
