<b>Assessment methods:</b> <i>Students have to pass an exam to receive credits. Continuous assessment (e.g. test, individual work...): 50%, written work. Final assessment (e.g. exam, final work...): 50 %, oral exam, test.</i>	
<b>Learning outcomes of the course unit:</b> <i>Students <b>gain</b> deeper knowledge from history of Slovakia. They also <b>widen</b> their knowledge from Slovak national history in the context of European history. Students have a general knowledge of historical events, which were connected with the territory and population of Slovakia, and formed its history.</i>

The most important archaeological discoveries.</i> <i>4. Celts and Romans in the territory of present Slovakia.</i> <i>5. Arrival of the Slavs in the territory of present Slovakia.</i> <i>6. First state structures of the Slavs.</i> <i>7. Principality of Nitra.</i> <i>8. Great Moravia.</i> <i>9. Slovakia in the multi-ethnic Hungarian state.</i> <i>10. Slovakia in the Middle-Ages. Formation and development of cities.</i> <i>11. Class revolutions.</i> <i>12. National revival. Revolution years 1848-1849.</i> <i>13. National and political fight of Slovaks during the period of dualistic monarchy at the end of 19<sup>th</sup> century.</i>
